Commission statement on Jodie Adams' retirement announcement

Springfield-Greene County Park Board Chair Jerry Clark has informed the Greene County Commission that Director of Parks Jodie Adams has announced her upcoming retirement.

The Commission praised Adams for her 37 years of service with the Park Board and noted her role in the expansion of Parks, in elevating the quality of services parks offer, and in bringing national attention and acclaim to the Springfield-Greene County Park Board.

The three Commissioners also issued the following statements:

“There is no doubt that the level of quality of our county’s parks today is due to Jodie’s unrelenting passion. Our community is maturing and coming of age, and our parks certainly reflect that. The County Commission is particularly appreciative of Jodie’s assistance in fostering the growth of parks in unincorporated Greene County and other municipalities.
