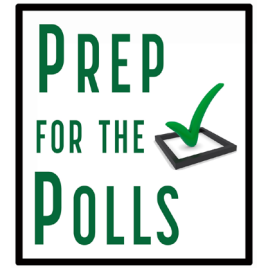

✓ REGISTRATION

Wednesday, March 8, 2017, is the last day for Greene County residents to register for the Tuesday, April 4 election.

✓ CHANGE OF ADDRESS

You may come in and change your address at the Greene County Clerk's office up through the day before the election. You can actually change your address on election day, but if you wish to avoid delay, it is wise to make this change before you go vote.

✓ ABSENTEE VOTING

All qualified voters wishing to vote absentee in person may do so now at the **Archives/Election Center building, 1126 N. Boonville** and enter through the Archive entrance, **8 a.m. to 5 p.m.** All requests to receive an absentee ballot by mail must be received by Clerk's office no later than 5 p.m. on the Wednesday immediately preceding an election. All absentee ballots voted via mail must be received by Clerk's office no later than 7 p.m. on election day in order to be counted. ✓ KNOW YOUR POLLING PLACE

To find your individual polling place, to go the "Elections 2017" tab on the County Clerk's website (see below). Click on "Where's My Polling Place" in the drop-down menu to find a number of options available to search for your polling location based on your address of registration. **Polling places with new locations:**

✓ 45A – Temporary polling location Unity of Springfield Church has moved back to the Schweitzer Brentwood Library at 2214 S. Brentwood Blvd.

✓ WHAT TO BRING WITH YOU

Missouri requires voters to show proper ID when voting. Currently, the following types of identification are those permissible by law:

- Identification issued by the state of Missouri, an agency of the state, or a local election authority of the state;
- Identification issued by the U.S. government or agency thereof;
- Identification issued by an institution of higher education, including a university, college, vocational and technical school, located within Missouri;
- A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that contains the name and address of the voter;
- Driver's license or state ID card issued by another state.
