ACCESSIBLE VOTING, TURNOUT, SOME POLLS CLOSED

Voters with disabilities which prevent them from reading or marking an optical scan paper ballot

will have an alternative next Tuesday. On Tuesday, April 5, voters with physical or visual

impairments will have the option of voting an optical scan ballot with assistance at their usual

polling place, or casting their vote on an accessible machine at the Clerk's Office. Voters with

special needs who wish to use the device should come to the County Clerk's Office, 940

Boonville, Room 113, on Election Day during regular voting hours—6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Voter turnout is expected to be higher than recent April elections. "We expect 15 to 20 percent

of our voters to participate on April 5th," said Struckhoff. The Clerk believes two issues for

Springfield voters, and property tax questions for Ebenezer Fire District and the Ash Grove R-4

and Walnut Grove R-5 School Districts will increase turnout.

Two Greene County polling sites will not be open Tuesday because voters in those areas have

no candidates or issues on which to vote: Clay-B (River of Life Church) and Washington

Township (Rogersville Middle School) will not be open for voting because the Rogersville R-8

School District wasn't required to hold a board election this year.
