## JURY CONVICTS DRUG TRAFFICKER

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – Greene County Prosecuting Attorney Dan Patterson announces that James D. Cardelli, 24, of Springfield, Missouri, was convicted yesterday, November 16, 2016, by a Greene County Jury of the offenses of trafficking methamphetamine in the 2<sup>nd</sup> degree and possession of hydrocodone for events that took place on or about February 20, 2016 in Springfield, Missouri.

The evidence at trial showed that the Defendant was carrying a backpack when he arrived at a residence where police had responded to a call for service. The Defendant was arrested for an outstanding warrant, and law enforcement found approximately 60 grams of methamphetamine in the Defendant's pocket. A subsequent search of the Defendant's backpack revealed an unmarked pill bottle containing hydrocodone pills, multiple unused plastic baggies, a digital scale, and over \$1,400 in cash. The Defendant admitted to law enforcement that he was a methamphetamine dealer, that he had been actively selling methamphetamine and that if law enforcement had stopped him earlier in the week he would have had more methamphetamine on his person.

A typical user amount of methamphetamine is approximately one gram, which typically sells for \$80 to \$100 a gram on the streets of Springfield.

The jury trial was presided over by The Honorable David Jones. The Defendant is subject to a sentence of five to fifteen years in the Department of Corrections on Count I and up to seven years in the Department of Corrections on Count II. Judge Jones set a sentencing hearing for January 5, 2017 at 1:30 p.m. following a sentencing assessment report by the Department of Probation and Parole.
