FLOODING HAZARD REPORT

Springfield-Greene County Office of Emergency Management

Current Warnings and Watches:

Flood Watch in effect from February 20, 6:00 AM until February 21, 6:00 AM.

Hazards:

Flooding	<i>Elevated</i>
Ice Accumulation	<i>Elevated</i>

Summary:

Several rounds of showers and thunderstorms with heavy rain will be possible tonight through Tuesday night across the area and may lead to some flooding, especially in low-lying areas, smaller streams and creeks, and low-water crossings. Two to three inches of rainfall will be possible with the main chances for flooding occurring during the day Tuesday into Tuesday night.

A cold front will begin pushing into the area on Tuesday with sub-freezing temperatures pushing in late Tuesday into Tuesday night, causing rain to change over to some freezing rain. Periods of freezing rain will be possible from Tuesday night into Thursday morning. Ice amounts of a tenth to quarter of an inch will be possible.

Threat Recommendations:

- Be prepared to move away from flood-prone areas. If you observe flooded roadways, "Turn around...don't drown!"
- Monitor forecasts and be alert for possible Flood Warnings. Those living in areas prone to flooding should be prepared to take action should flooding develop.
- Be prepared to reduce travel speed for hazardous travel conditions especially on bridges, overpasses, untreated and secondary roads.
