Current Warnings and Watches:

Flood Watch Monday evening through Tuesday night.

Summary:

Isolated non-severe storms will continue across the area this afternoon with heavy rain beginning tonight.

Discussion:

Scattered storms will continue across the area this afternoon. A few strong to marginally severe storms will be possible, with penny to quarter size hail being the main risk and a small potential of 50 to 60 mph wind over far southwest Missouri.

A front will sag south into the area late this evening into the overnight hours. A band of showers and thunderstorms are expected to develop along the front, which will likely stall near the I-44 corridor. A few strong storms will be possible, with hail to the size of pennies being the main risk. In addition to the small hail risk, heavy rainfall training along the same locations could lead to some flooding across the area.

Guidance:

- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Do not drive through water covered roadways! *“Turn around... don't drown.”*
