Discussion:

While the greatest chance for severe weather is along and north of I-44, Greene County can still be affected by thunderstorms late this evening and into the overnight hours. If these storms become severe, they could contain large hail, damaging wind gusts, and tornadoes.

The threat will continue Thursday with an elevated risk of both severe thunderstorms and lightning with the potential for all modes of weather associated with intense thunderstorms.

Long Term:

Thunderstorms should leave the area Thursday night, ending the severe weather threat with mild weather returning throughout next week.

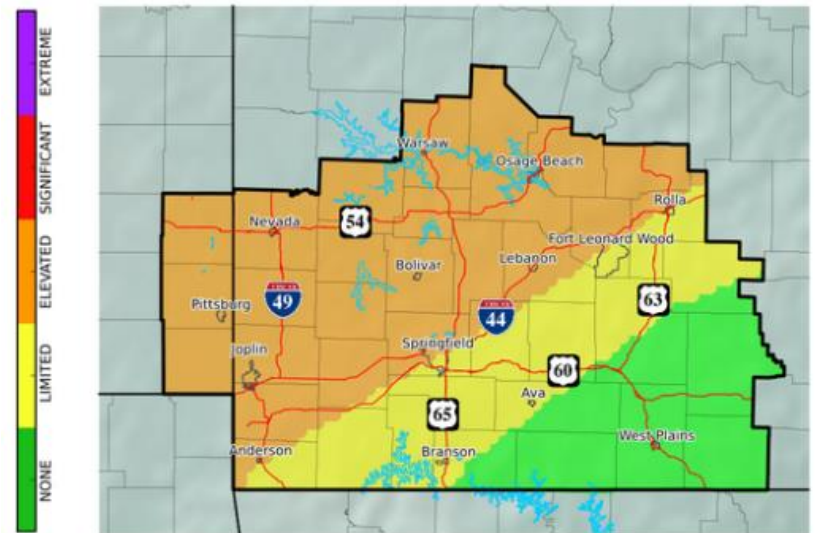
