Weather Hazards Expected:

A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect until January 13, 24:00. No watches or warnings at this time.

Discussion:

Rain will continue mixing with sleet and snow as the evening begins. This will switch to "wet" snow in the overnight hours. Precipitation will continue into Saturday when a rain/snow/sleet mixture will return. A glaze of ice on elevated objects could also be possible throughout the event. The heaviest accumulations of snow and ice are expected to be to the east of Greene County.

Additional hazard reports will be published if conditions change in either direction.

Travel Issues:

Impacts: Travel conditions could become hazardous late Friday afternoon, potentially impacting commutes. These conditions will continue through Saturday evening. Extra care should be taken when traversing elevated surfaces and secondary roads.

Preparedness Considerations: Consider a winter storm kit for your car. Winterize your vehicle. Pay close attention to upcoming weather information. Watch for social media posts from OEM and our affiliated partners.
