Discussion:

Gusty NW winds up to 45 mph will develop across the area this morning into the afternoon. This will reduce visibilities in areas of snow. Total snowfall amounts from a dusting to one inch will be possible. Wind chill values will drop into the single digits by this afternoon.

Travel Issues:

Impacts: Plan on slippery road conditions due to rapidly dropping temperatures. Black ice will also be possible. Visibilities could be reduced in the snow due to very gusty winds. Strong winds could cause difficulty driving on area roadways today, especially for high profile vehicles. Use extra caution. Loose outdoor objects could become displaced.

Preparedness Considerations: Consider a winter storm kit for your car. Winterize your vehicle. Pay close attention to upcoming weather information. Watch for social media posts from OEM and affiliated partners.
