Ice Accumulation	Elevated

Excessive Cold	Limited

Discussion:

Gusty south winds will shift to the NW tonight as a cold front passes through. Winds will gust up to 30 MPH at times. Rain will change to a wintery mix and then freezing drizzle from west to east. Wind chills will dip into the single digits and teens late tonight.

Travel Issues:

Impacts: A minor glaze of ice will be likely on exposed surfaces. Due to the temperature untreated roads may become slick in spots.

Preparedness Considerations: Consider a winter storm kit for your car. Winterize your vehicle. Pay close attention to upcoming weather information. Watch for social media posts from OEM and affiliated partners.



