Watches/Warnings:

Hazards:

Lightning Severe Thunderstorms Hail

Discussion:

A front will spread across the area in the early evening. Showers and thunderstorms are possible along the front, especially east of I-49. The main risk will be large hail and cloud to ground lightning strikes. The best strong to severe potential will occur southeast of a line from Cassville to the Lake of the Ozarks region this afternoon.

Citizen Action Statement:

Citizens should consider the following guidance:

- Take shelter when lightning is in the area!
 - "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
 - "Turn around...don't drown!"
- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)

Emergency Management Issues:

- Springfield-Greene County EOC is currently at OpCon Level 3: Monitoring
- All interested parties should continue to monitor the situation for continuing forecast changes.
