9-1-1 Advisory Board Meeting February 20, 2019

- CALL TO ORDER The Greene County 9-1-1 Advisory Board was called to order by Chair Williams on February 20, 2019 at 3:03 p.m. in the Public Safety Center, 9-1-1 Conference room at 330 W. Scott Street, Springfield, MO 65802. Nine board members and proxies were in attendance. *Attendance details in Attachment*.
- 2. APPROVAL January 16, 2019 Meeting Minutes Williams indicated a draft of the meeting minutes were distributed to the board members for review prior to the meeting. Pennington motioned to approve the minutes, Moore seconded. Motion carried 9/0.

3. STATUS UPDATES

Financial Reports - Jeff Scott, representing the Greene County Budget Office, presented the December Financial reports. Revenues out-performed budget by 2.12%. Overall expenditures were 91.1% of budget and \$679,448.83 less than acutal revenues. Personnel expenditures were 90.47% of budget leaving a vacancy of \$456,863.38. Operations were 103.93% of budget or \$36,686.71 over. The largest variance was Network Line which was \$26,031.28 higher and included 13 months of billing. Still this budget was at least \$8,000 low. The next largest variance was Building Maintenance which was \$13,105.05 higher. The county breaks out maintenance cost based on square footage and time of use. The final large variance was the Springfield Plaza TIF which was 8,949.62 below budget. This is a new item. Capital, Debt Service & Contingency was 81% of budget. Contingency is not spent on this line so you already start at 78% of budget. Computer Equipment was at 424.96% of budget or \$29,246.64 over. This line was entirely the Stancil Logging Recorder which was a possible expense which was covered by contingency balance. Cash balance at 12/31/18 consisted of the \$300,000.00 equipment reserve and \$3,827,551.21 in the warrant account. This is \$1,140,670 higher than last year and 2.637 times larger than required operating reserve level. End of year adjustments include the December debt service transfer of \$56,363.48 and 4 uncleared checks totalling of \$888,763.37. This leaves a net cash value of \$3,182,424.36 (\$95,543 higher than last year non-net cash position). Cash level is 1.985 times larger than required operating reserve level of \$1,602,950.

Jeff also compared the 2019 budget to 2018 results.

4. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Emergency Communications Department Update Schwartze The January monthly "Atta's" and compliments were passed around. There was one external complaint in January which was unfounded after investigation. The Springfield-Greene County 9-1-1 call takers are currently at 86.39% response time.
- **B. P1CAD and Statistics Update Webb** The January and Year-to-Date 9-1-1 Reports were provided. Webb noted 9-1-1 calls were down the previous year. He stated the new Zetron 2200 replacement is now up and running thanks to the assistance from City Utilities.

C. 2018 Year-End Statistics –Schwartze – Schwartze noted 2017 and 2018 statistics were very similar. She stated 2018 had a slight drop in 9-1-1 calls. Schwartze noted both overtime use and FMLA use have been reduced. She stated the average turnover rate for most 9-1-1 Centers is 19% and the Springfield-Greene County 9-1-1 Emergency Communications Department had a turnover rate of 10.95% in 2018.

5. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Term Expires February 19th- Coulter agreed to have the positions re-elected to their current representative positions by the Commission. A letter was sent to Commission in reference to Schrader's position and another will be for the other two positions.

 - 2. Paul Williams-Springfield Police Department Representative
 - 3. Sarah Schrader-Springfield Business Representative
- **B.** Chair and Vice-Chair Vote- Langley nominated Chief Paul Williams for the position of Chair and Chris Coulter seconded the nomination. Moore made the motion to approve and was seconded by Coulter. Motion carried 9/0. Pennington nominated Scott Moore for the position of Vice-Chair and was seconded by Langley. Pennington made the motion to approve and was seconded by Quigley. Motion carried 9/0.
- **6. ADJOURNMENT --** With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at approximately 4:03 p.m. Mericle motioned to adjourn, Schrader seconded. Motion carried 9/0.
