Discussion:

Thunderstorms are expected to move through area this evening into tonight. Approximate timing for the Springfield area is 1:00 AM – 3:00 AM. Storm activity is expected to begin with discrete supercells and evolve into lines or segments. Cloud to ground lightning, heavy downpours, large hail up to 1.25 inches, damaging winds to 60 mph, and tornadoes are possible. Localized flooding will be possible this evening and tonight, especially where storms track over already saturated areas. Confidence Level: Good for severe weather. Timing is in question.

Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area! "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels. "Turn around...don't drown!"
