Discussion:

Isolated severe thunderstorms with 1-inch hail, winds to 60 mph, and lightning are possible late Friday into Saturday. A low-confidence, high impact scenario is setting up from late this weekend into Thurs. for periods of heavy rainfall. Confidence is increasing that the event will occur; however, confidence in the locations and actual amounts of rain remain low. This system should be monitored closely into the weekend.

Confidence Level: Forecast confidence at this time is **LOW TO MEDIUM**.

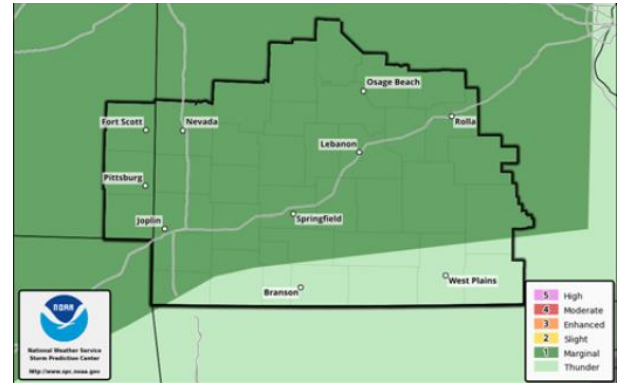
Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area! *"When thunder roars...go indoors!"*
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels. *"Turn around...don't drown!"*

- Springfield-Greene County EOC is currently at **OpCon Level 3: Monitoring**
