
Discussion:

Multiple thunderstorm complexes are expected over the area tonight through Friday morning. **Timing:** After midnight. A few of these storms could become severe, with damaging wind gusts in excess of 60 mph, 1-inch hail, frequent cloud to ground lightning, and flash flooding possible. Ongoing heavy thunderstorms are expected across the area Thursday morning and afternoon. A few of these storms are expected to become severe, with excessive rainfall rates and flash flooding possible. **Confidence:** Medium to High for Flash Flooding.

Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area! "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels. "Turn around...don't drown!"
