Discussion:

Showers and thunderstorms are possible this afternoon into early this evening. Additional storms are expected later this evening into the overnight hours. A few strong to severe storms are possible, especially south of I-44. Potential hazards include frequent cloud-to-ground lightning, damaging winds in excess of 60 mph, and 1-inch hail. Heavy rainfall rates may lead to isolated flooding tonight.

Citizen Action Statement:


- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area! "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels. *"Turn around...don't drown!"*


Emergency Management Issues:
