#### Discussion:


Strong to severe storms are expected to impact Greene County from late this afternoon into the early morning hours as a strong cold front moves through the Ozarks. Main threats are damaging winds gusts from 45-55mph, nickle-sized hail, and possibly a brief tornado given the limited instability.

Flooding is possible between Thusday morning and Saturday night as periods of moderate to heavy rainfall may occur.

### **Citizen Action Statement:**

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area! "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels. "Turn around...don't drown!"


#### NonThunderstorm Wind Risk Valid: 11/26/2019 08:00 AM - 11/27/2019 06:00 AM CST
