A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect until Dec. 17, 2400.

Discussion

Periods of snow, sleet, and freezing rain will track across mainly the eastern Ozarks through the early to mid-afternoon hours. Some isolated thunder will also be possible within this activity, with less than 0.1 of an inch of ice and up to an additional inch of snow. Another band of light snow will move into the area from Kansas from late this afternoon into the evening hours with a dusting to 1 inch of snow possible. Wind chills will drop into the teens to around the 10 degree mark tonight.

Travel Issues

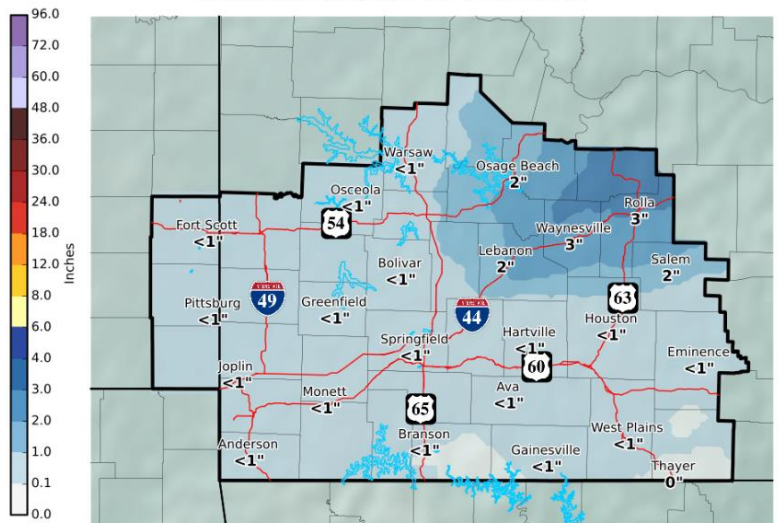
Impacts: Wet road surfaces could turn into black ice as temperatures drop through the 20s over the next several hours.

Preparedness Considerations: Consider a winter storm kit for your car. Winterize your vehicle. Pay close attention to upcoming weather information. Watch for social media posts from OEM and affiliated partners.
