Weather Hazards Expected

A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect until Dec. 17, 1200. A Flood Watch goes into effect early morning Dec 17 until late evening Dec 17.

Discussion

Northerly wind gusts up to 30 mph are likely across the Ozarks today. This will create wind chills in the teens. A wintry mix of rain, freezing rain, light snow, and light sleet will be possible from tonight into Friday morning. Up to a tenth of an inch of freezing rain accumulation will be possible before temperatures warm turning all precipitation into liquid rain.

Friday through Saturday

Storm total precipitation ranging from roughly an inch to around an inch and three quarters is expected across the entire region. Widespread flooding is expected as soil conditions are saturated from heavy rains experienced last week. Gusty winds around 30 mph will be possible at times Friday into Saturday.

Travel Issues

Impacts:

- Freezing rain is likely during the Friday morning commute
- Heaviest wintry precip will occur between 6 AM and Noon
- Air temperatures will be in the 29-32 °F range

• Most locations will see ice accretion on the order of a few hundredths, but pockets of a tenth-to-one-quarter inch will occur in areas that see air temperatures dip below 29° F for multiple hours

Preparedness Considerations: Consider a winter storm kit for your car. Winterize your vehicle. Pay close attention to upcoming weather information. Watch for social media posts from OEM and affiliated partners.
