Discussion

Rain has begun moving into the area early this afternoon and will overspread the area this evening into tonight. A light wintry mix will then be possible this evening and overnight as temperatures drop to around freezing. Snow is then likely overnight mainly north of highway 60, lasting through Wednesday morning. Warmer areas near the Arkansas border may see all rain or only a mix of rain and snow Tuesday night.

Locations across southwest Missouri and southeast Kansas will see up to a half to one and a half inches of snow by Wednesday morning, with lesser amounts along the Arkansas border. This snowfall may impact the Wednesday morning commute.

Travel Issues

- Light snow will end from west to east late Wednesday morning
- Areas Impacted: Mainly along and north of US Highway 60
- Impacts: Slippery roads during the Friday morning commute
- Total snow accumulation for the event is expected to be approximately 1-2 inches of snow.

Preparedness Considerations

Consider a winter storm kit for your car. Winterize your vehicle. Pay close attention to upcoming weather information. Watch for social media posts from OEM and affiliated partners.
