Discussion:

Showers and thunderstorms continuing to move through the area this morning will bring frequent cloud to ground lightning, wind gusts up to 50 mph, and small hail. Heavy rainfall leading to flash flooding will also be possible. Strong to severe thunderstorms possible from late morning into the early evening hours with the highest chances east of Highway 65 and south of Interstate 44. Hazards associated with these storms include: damaging winds, large hail to the size of golf balls, and tornadoes.

Southerly winds will become gusty by late morning and afternoon with wind gusts of 35 to 45 mph possible, especially west of Highway 65.

Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area! "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels. "Turn around...don't drown!"


Emergency Management Issues:
