Hazards

Tornado	Limited
Excessive Rainfall	Elevated
Lightning	Limited
Non-Thunderstorm Wind	Limited

Discussion:

There is potential for some low-topped supercells over far south- central Missouri as Cristobal approaches the area. There is a low end tornado risk late this afternoon into this evening with any of these stronger storms, but hail and damaging winds are not expected.

Widespread rainfall amounts of one to three inches are expected to fall later today and tonight across portions of the Missouri Ozarks. Some locally heavier amounts can be expected, leading to an elevated risk for flash flooding. These showers and thunderstorms will occur in response to tropical depression Cristobal.

Wind gusts will approach 30 mph later tonight.

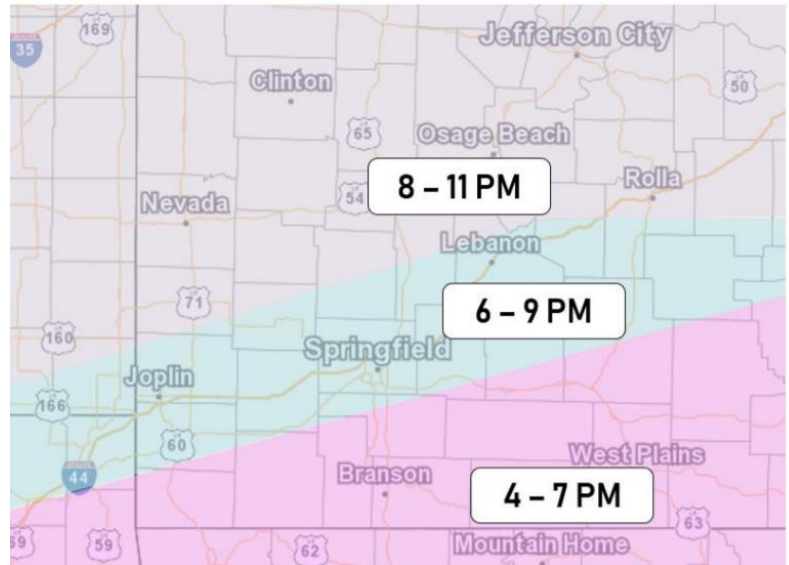
Days two through seven...Tuesday through Sunday.

Residual flooding from rainfall this evening into Tuesday morning is expected.

Severe thunderstorms will be possible late Tuesday afternoon into early Tuesday night. Large hail, damaging winds, and perhaps a tornado or two are possible. Confidence in timing, coverage, and strength of storms is limited at this time.

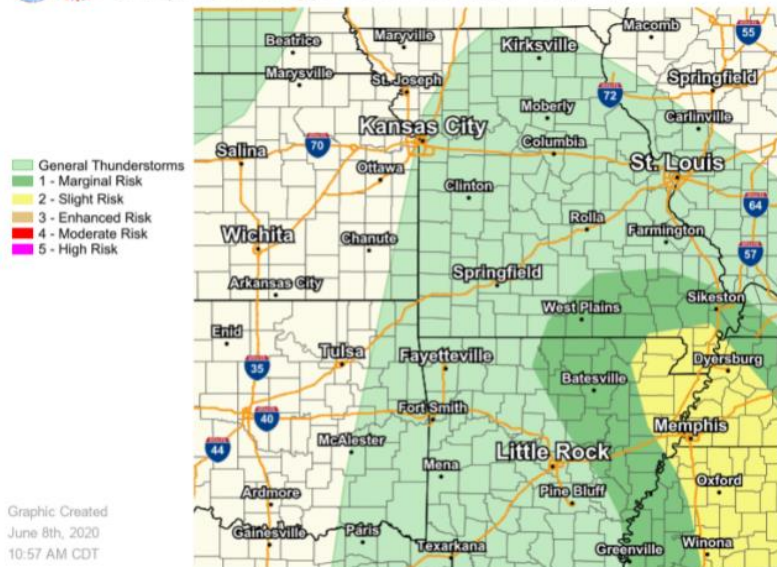
Wind gusts of 30-40 mph are possible Tuesday afternoon into Tuesday night over southeast Kansas and western Missouri. Gusts up to 30-35 mph are then possible across much of the area Wednesday.

Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area! *"When thunder roars...go indoors!"*
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels. *"Turn around...don't drown!"*

- Springfield-Greene County EOC is currently at **OpCon Level 2: Activation (Virtual/Physical)**
