A **Winter Weather Advisory** is currently in effect for portions of southwestern Missouri, mainly southwest of Greene County.

Snow/Sleet	Limited

Discussion

Snow is expected for some areas Sunday as a storm system tracks from Texas into the Lower Mississippi Valley. Snow is expected to spread west to east over the outlook area during the mid and late morning hours and then continue at times during the afternoon before tapering off from the west during the evening.

Temperatures are expected to be just above freezing most of this time with a wet snow having some difficulty accumulating on road surfaces. Some slushy, slick spots may briefly develop on elevated road and bridge surfaces, but most of the accumulation will be on grassy surfaces. One to three inches may be possible in some areas with the best chances for that occurring over higher elevations of the southern Missouri Ozarks.

Travel Issues

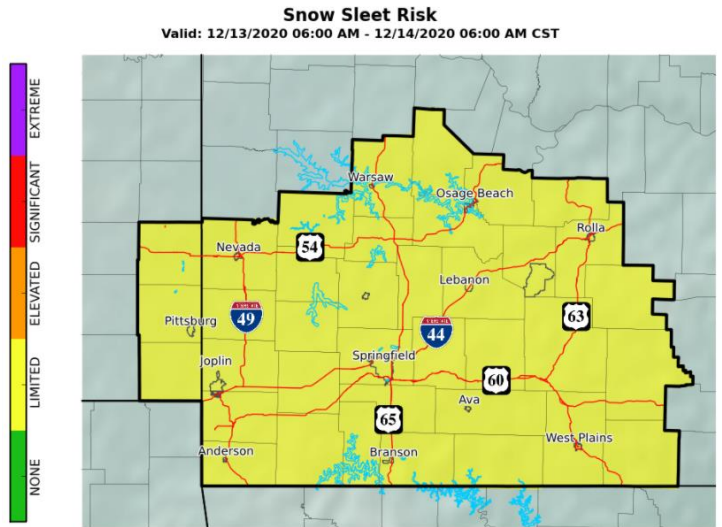
- Areas Impacted: Mainly north of the I-44 corridor
- Impacts: Some slushy, slick spots may develop on elevated surfaces; most accumulation will be on grassy surfaces

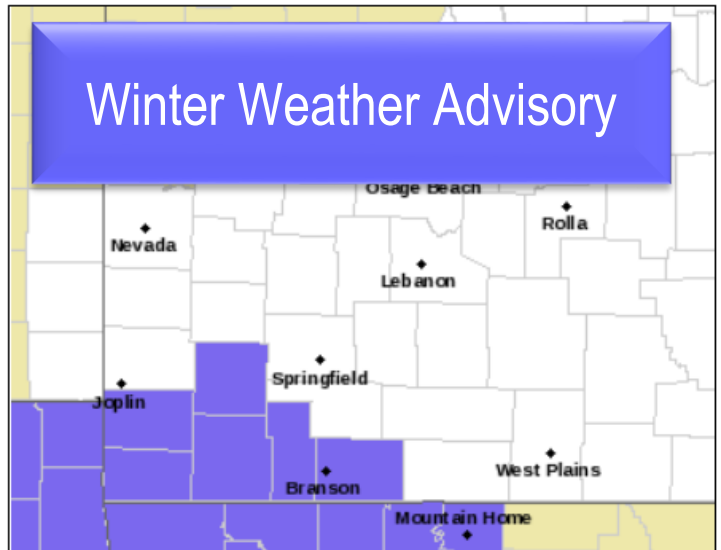
