Light freezing drizzle will continue to develop across much of the area this afternoon, throughout Monday, and into Monday night. Cold air and road temperatures will lead to hazardous travel, especially on untreated roads. Low temperatures could fall into the single digits at times late this week, with wind chills likely below zero.

Travel Issues


- Areas Impacted: Lowest accumulation is expected over south central Missouri. Higher amounts may be found north and west of that region.
- Impacts: Difficult travel conditions are possible.
- Total ice accumulations of up to one tenth of an inch are possible.

Preparedness Considerations


