#### Discussion

Plan on slippery road conditions. The hazardous conditions could impact the morning or evening commute. The cold wind chills as low as 20 below zero could result in hypothermia if precautions are not taken.


Snow will start moving into southwest Missouri and southeast Kansas late this evening and spread northeast across the area overnight. Highest amounts of 3 to 4 inches will generally be south of the U.S. 60 corridor while 2 to 3 inches are expected north of U.S. 60.

# **Travel Issues**

- Timing: Midnight through tomorrow late morning.
- Areas Impacted: Roadways across Greene County are covered with blowing snow reducing visibility.
- Total Accumulation: 2 to 3 inches across the area with locally higher accumulation amounts possible.







#### **Utility Issues**

Extreme weather conditions are placing a high demand on natural gas supplies affecting the region. This will have an impact on natural gas, propane and electric supplies across the region. Natural Gas wells are freezing in the southwest and limiting supply, causing suppliers to increase prices on the remaining supplies of natural gas. This is an unprecedented event that is affecting natural gas and propane user across the Midwest. Conservation of natural gas and propane is extremely important to the degree possible. In addition, electric production has been affected by both increased use and the critical demand on gas availability. Limit electrical usage to the degree possible. 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#### **Preparedness Considerations**

Consider a winter storm kit for your car. Winterize your vehicle. Pay close attention to upcoming weather information. Watch for social media posts from OEM and affiliated partners. *Slow down and use caution while traveling.* Conserve natural gas, propane and electricity to the extent possible. *Regardless of who your utility provider is, prepare for possible utility interruptions.* Check on your elderly neighbors and bring pets indoors. <u>STAY SAFE AND REMAIN WEATHER AWARE!</u>
