#### Discussion:

Scattered thunderstorms are expected to develop near the Interstate 44 corridor late this afternoon along a southeastward advancing cold front. These storms will then expand in coverage while pushing southeast into south-central Missouri this evening. Storms should then exit the Missouri Ozarks shortly after midnight.

Enough instability and wind shear will be present to support the potential for a few severe storms. Hail to the size of half dollars and damaging wind gusts will be the primary potential severe weather hazards.

#### Citizen Action Statement:

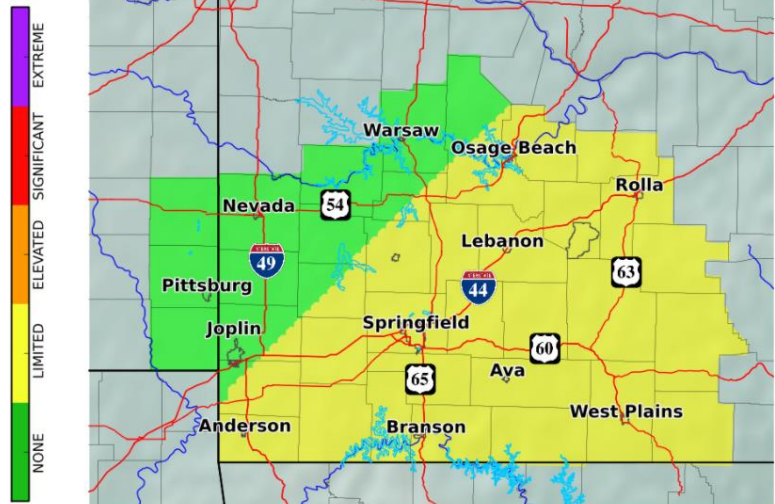
- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area! *“When thunder roars...go indoors!”*
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels. *“Turn around...don’t drown!”*
