Discussion:

Strong to severe thunderstorms are expected to develop later today and into this evening. As the atmosphere destabilizes through the late morning and into the afternoon, storm coverage will increase as the unstable airmass interacts with an outflow boundary over central Missouri and a cold front over southern Kansas.

The storms will have the potential to produce damaging wind gusts in excess of 70 mph, large hail and the possibility of tornadoes. With high rainfall rates expected, there will also be a risk for flash flooding. Please keep updated with the latest weather situation today.

Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area! "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels. "Turn around...don't drown!"
