

Discussion:

Intense thunderstorm development is forecasted as early as midafternoon across southeast Kansas into western Missouri, which includes Greene County. Key message:

- Damaging winds of 60-70 mph
- Hail up to the size of golf balls
- Tornado threat is low but not zero
- Flash flooding is possible in flood prone areas

Locations south of a Pittsburg Kansas to Springfield to Gainesville line have the highest potential for severe weather.


Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area! "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels. *"Turn around...don't drown!"*
