## Intoxicated Driver Sentenced to 12 Year Prison Sentence for Involuntary Manslaughter

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – Dan Patterson, Greene County Prosecuting Attorney announced that Jeremy William Arata, 24, of Springfield, Missouri, was sentenced today on an involuntary manslaughter charge arising from a 2007 drunk driving crash that resulted in the death of Paul Fain, also of Springfield, Missouri.

Arata was convicted of the B felony of involuntary manslaughter following a 3 day jury trial held in May, 2011. The jury found that Arata was intoxicated on November 15, 2007, when the vehicle he was driving struck a vehicle driven by Fain. Arata's vehicle was going at speeds near 60 miles an hour in a residential area when it collided with a vehicle driven by Fain. Fain died as a result of the injuries he suffered in the collision. Arata's blood alcohol level was measured at .146%.

Arata was sentenced by The Honorable Calvin Holden to 12 years in the Missouri Department of Corrections for charges contained in the felony information. Probation was denied. The B felony of involuntary manslaughter is punishable by five to 15 years incarceration. Arata must serve eighty-five percent of that sentence before becoming eligible for parole, pursuant to Missouri statute.

Arata is currently serving a 3 year prison sentence for leaving the scene of an accident with a 2005 offense date. He also has a conviction for a driving while intoxicated offense which occurred in 2009.

This case was prosecuted by Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Emily Carlstrom. It was investigated by the Springfield Police Department and Detective Patrick Carey was the lead investigator assigned to the case.
