

Greene County American Rescue Plan Act Citizen Advisory Committee

In 2021, the U.S. Senate passed the American Rescue Plan Act to provide direct funding to states, territories and tribal governments. The goal is to promote recovery by funding programs and services that support the needs of those impacted by COVID-19. An initial deposit of \$28,464,260 arrived on May 19, 2021 and the second allocation is scheduled to arrive in late spring of 2022. In total, Greene County will receive \$56,928,520 in ARPA funding to support local efforts to recover from COVID-19.

To help ensure equitable allocation of these funds locally, the Greene County Commission has appointed a citizen advisory committee from a diverse number of sectors to bring their expertise to the County's ARPA application review and approval process.

Candace Adams, Emergency Management Retiree and Educator

Adams is retired from both Greene County OEM and Missouri SEMA where she coordinated disaster mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery planning for 18 counties.
