## Discussion

Light rain will transition to a light wintry mix before changing to light snow this afternoon and evening. Less than 1/2" of snow is expected along with potentially a very thin glaze of ice on elevated surfaces.

Northerly winds will gust to 30 mph through the evening. Low temperatures and gusty winds will decrease wind chill values to near 0 degrees tonight.

Wind chills will likely be in the single digits range above and below zero on Thursday and Friday mornings.

## Travel Issues

- Gusty winds will lead to dangerously low wind chill values
- Slick spots will be possible mainly on elevated surfaces
- Slow down and use caution while traveling.

- Total snow accumulation expected: > 1/2"
