Discussion:

Showers and isolated thunderstorms may move through the area this afternoon. No severe weather is expected with this activity however lightning is possible. Heavier showers and thunderstorms will develop generally after 4:00 pm across southern Missouri, especially south of Interstate 44. While the primary risks is large hail to the size of golf balls and frequent lightning, a few storms could produce damaging winds. The tornado threat is very low. Storms will likely move south into Arkansas by midnight. If thunderstorms are able to move over the same areas this evening, then some localized flooding will be possible. Southerly wind gusts this afternoon may reach 25 to 30 mph.

Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area!
 - "When thunder roars...go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around...don't drown!"
