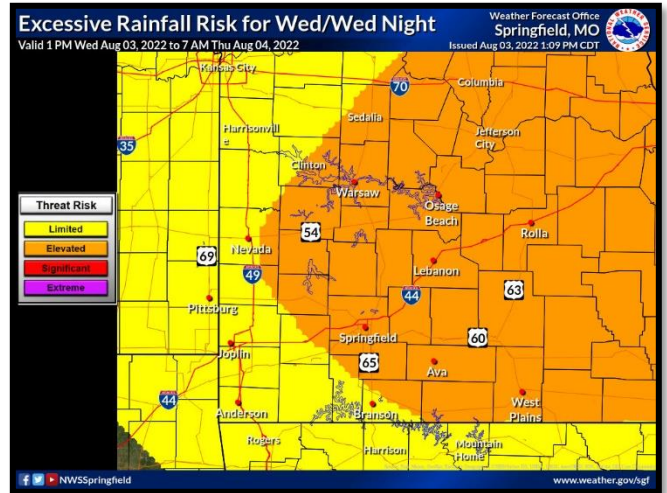

#### Discussion

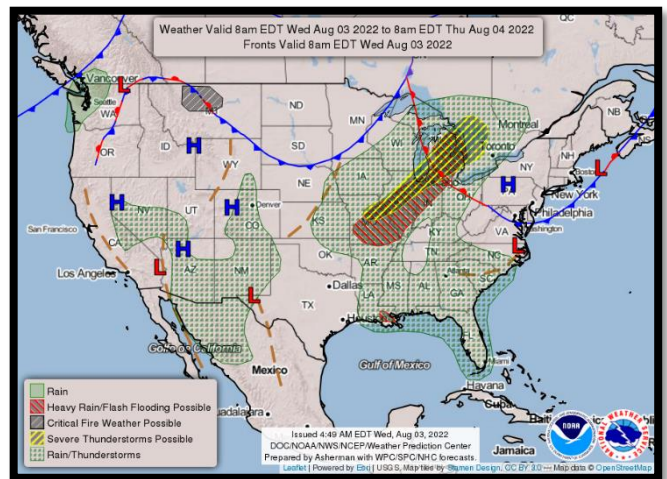
Heat index values of 100 to 108 degrees are expected today.

A few severe thunderstorms can be expected this evening. Large hail to the size of quarters and damaging winds of 60 to 70 mph are the most likely severe hazards. Frequent cloud to ground lightning is also likely.

Localized areas could see heavy rainfall that leads to flash flooding tonight with the repeated rounds of rainfall. .

#### Citizen Action Statement

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.  
**“When thunder roars...go indoors!”**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.  
**“Turn around...don’t drown!”**
