Discussion:

Widespread showers and thunderstorms are expected late this afternoon through this evening. There is a low end chance for a few isolated strong to severe thunderstorms. Damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph and hail up to quarter size are the primary hazards. A spin-up tornado cannot be ruled out. Flooding threat will remain limited by the progressive nature of the system and recent dry conditions. Additionally, strong gusty winds of 30-45 mph will accompany the system today and tonight.

Citizen Action Statement:

- Have a severe weather shelter plan! Review emergency kit and identify closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area! "When thunder roars...go indoors!" Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along area rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels. "Turn around...don't drown!"
