DISCUSSION

A winter storm will bring accumulating snowfall to the region late Tuesday afternoon into Wednesday. Impacts to travel are likely with this system. Areas along and especially southeast of interstate 44 have the greatest potential for higher snowfall amounts and impacts. Snowfall amounts of 5 to 10 inches are likely with localized amounts up to 12 inches south of I-44. Areas north of I-44 snowfall amounts of 2 to 4 inches are likely with localized amounts up to 6 inches.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **“When thunder roars . . . go indoors!”**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
