### **DISCUSSION**

A winter storm will bring accumulating snowfall to the region late this afternoon into Wednesday morning. Impacts to travel are likely to begin this evening. Areas along and especially southeast of interstate 44 have the greatest potential for heavy snowfall and major impacts. Snowfall amounts of 5 to 10 inches are likely with localized amounts up to 12 inches south of the I-44 corridor. Updated graphics show northward expansion to Winter Storm Warning.

North wind gusts up to 30 mph are likely overnight across south central Missouri. This could cause some drifting of snow and reduced visibilities in these areas.
