DISCUSSION

A very fast-moving line of showers and thunderstorms will push through the area late this evening into early Monday morning. Damaging straight line winds up to 75 mph will be main risk with the storms along and west of the Highway 65 corridor and up to 60 mph east of Highway 65. The tornado potential remains low and mainly focused to our southwest across Oklahoma.

Outside of thunderstorms, south to southwest wind gusts of 40 to 50 mph will occur through Monday morning.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.

- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

“Turn around . . . don’t drown!”
