DISCUSSION

Severe thunderstorms are likely to develop this afternoon, 4/15, with high confidence along and east of HWY 65 and as far west as I-49. Large hail, up to baseball size, is likely to occur with this system. There is also a low threat of isolated tornadoes.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **“When thunder roars . . . go indoors!”**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

“Turn around . . . don’t drown!”
