DISCUSSION

Scattered showers and thunderstorms develop late this morning into the early afternoon. Expect coverage to increase through the afternoon. There is the potential for a few strong to severe thunderstorms. Primary hazards include large hail up to size of quarters and damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph.

Non-thunderstorm wind gusts of 30 to 40 mph are expected early this morning before subsiding through the afternoon as winds turn west to northwest behind the frontal passage.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **“When thunder roars . . . go indoors!”**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
