DISCUSSION

Scattered storm development will be possible across western Missouri this afternoon into the early evening hours. Hail up to the size of half dollars (1.25 inches) and damaging winds will be the primary risks with these storms, but some storms over far western Missouri may have hail up to 2" in diameter.

Locally heavy rainfall will be possible with the storms today. Widespread flooding is not expected but some localized minor flooding could be possible for any locations that are affected by multiple storms in a short period of time.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"
