DISCUSSION

A Heat Advisory remains in effect for the area through this evening. Heat index values of 100 to 112 will occur this afternoon. This afternoon and evening scattered thunderstorms are expected to develop across portions of the area. A few strong to severe storms will be possible with gusty winds and locally heavy rainfall the main risk. A few of the strongest storms could be capable of hail up to the size of quarters.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Stay hydrated, stay in an air-conditioned room, limit time in the sun, and check on relatives and neighbors.
- Young children and pets should never be left unattended in vehicles under any circumstances.
- Take extra precautions if you work or spend time outside. When possible, reschedule strenuous activities to early morning or evening.
- To reduce risk during outdoor work, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration recommends scheduling frequent rest breaks in shaded or air-conditioned environments.
- Know the signs and symptoms of heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Wear lightweight and loose-fitting clothing when possible. Anyone overcome by heat should be moved to a cool and shaded location. Heat stroke is an emergency! Call 9-1-1.
