9-1-1 Advisory Board Meeting January 17, 2023

- 1. CALL TO ORDER The Greene County 9-1-1 Advisory Board was called to order by Vice Chair Pennington on January 17, 2023, via phone conference call. Seven board members were in attendance. *Attendance details in Attachment*.
- 2. APPROVAL –December 21, 2022 Meeting Minutes Pennington indicated a draft of the meeting minutes were distributed to the board members for review prior to the meeting. Williams motioned to approve the minutes; Denison seconded. Motion carried 7/0.

3. STATUS UPDATES

Financial Reports - The written report for the November Financials were presented by Deputy Budget Officer Tina Phillips. November represents 92% of the year. Sales tax is strong coming in over budget at 109% with 911 Service Charge at 90% and bank interest at 114% compared to budget. Overall revenue is coming in ahead of budget at 110%. This is currently \$1,500,235 ahead of pace. Personnel expenditures were compared to 91.2% compared to 92.3% for 24 of 26 pay periods with projected vacancy to be \$61,145 better than budget of \$275,000. Operations is running slightly under budget coming in at 91%. There were no changes from the previous month to Capital, Debt Service and Contingency which was reported at 64%. Overall, total expenditures is coming in below pace at 89% of budget. When making adjustments for one-time expenses (Gen.Liability, Telephone, Spfld All OvrHd, CAD System Main, Equipment), expenses are 87.5% of budget. Adjusted YTD Overall Budget is \$6,611,871 and Adjusted Overall YTD Spending is \$6,281,495 for a \$330,376 volume to the good through 11 months.

Cash balance at 11/30/22 was \$6,926,134.09 in the warrant account. This is \$2,327,441 higher than last year. Cash level is 3.89 times the required operating reserve level of \$1,665,031.
