### DISCUSSION

A storm system will bring a light mix of snow and rain to the area starting this morning and continuing into tonight. Any snow accumulations will generally remain below an inch.

There is also a slight chance (10% - 30%) of drizzle and freezing drizzle along the Ozark plateau tonight.

**Monday & Tuesday:** A large storm system will bring moderate to heavy precipitation to the region, including both rain and snow, along with gusty winds. Another Hazard Report will be issued at this time, if necessary.

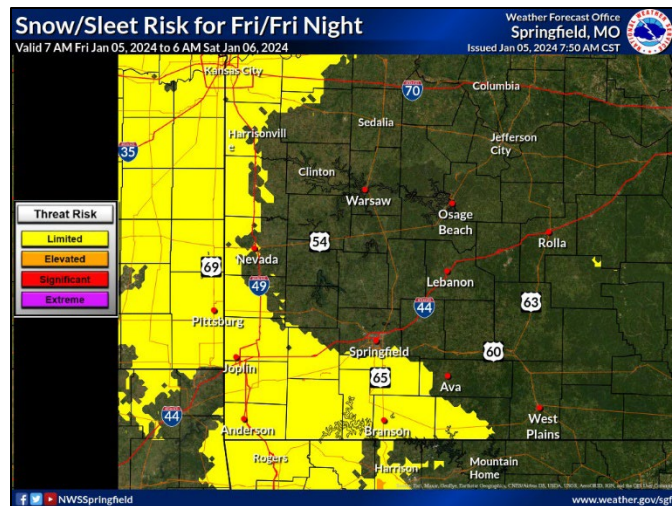
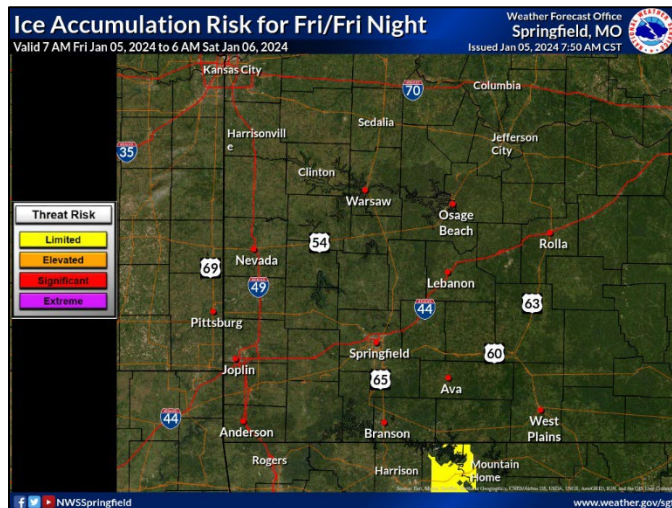
