## DISCUSSION

Wind Advisory tonight through Monday morning with sustained speeds of 20-30 MPH and gusts of 35-45 MPH. Widespread showers and heavy rain continue into Monday. Heavy rainfall will occur at times across south central Missouri, especially in the corridor along and south of I-44 where the heaviest rain bands set up and train. Rainfall totals of 2-3" within the areas of heaviest precipitation will cause flooding of low water crossings. A few embedded thunderstorms with cloud to ground lightning possible.

# **CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT**

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
