DISCUSSION

The next round of severe storms is expected to arrive overnight tonight into early Sunday morning. Damaging wind gusts of 75 MPH and greater, hail up to 2 inches in diameter, and tornados will all be possible with the storms late tonight. The highest risk of severe weather will occur west of the Highway 65 corridor. Supercells along the I-49 corridor beginning at approximately 2300 hours tonight are expected to transition into line segments as they approach the Highway 65 corridor at approximately 0200 Sunday morning May 26.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"
