### DISCUSSION

Flooding caused by excessive rainfall over the last 24 hours continues. Streams and rivers continue to rise due to excess runoff. Low-water crossings are inundated with water and may not be passable.

A few storms will remain possible during the afternoon over south central Missouri as the precipitation exits the area.

### CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **“When thunder roars . . . go indoors!”**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

**“Turn around . . . don’t drown!”**
