Family Connects

- Free, universal home visiting program offered to **all** families of newborns in Greene County
- Home visit from a trained nurse within the first 12 weeks postpartum

Mission: Strengthening connections for families with newborns and linking them directly to supportive community care resources.

Vision: Equitable outcomes for each and every newborn.





Family Connects was born in Durham, NC

- Modeled after Durham Connects
- Research and evaluation resulted in evidence-based model
- Demand from other communities led to creation of Family Connects International











Cultural competence

- Adapting services to meet families' unique needs







- All families have needs for health or social **support**
- Community-wide eligibility is essential to population change
- Offering the program to every family reduces barriers and encourages high rate of program acceptance and visit completion

From Family Connects International 2009-2019 (>10,000 families)





1 in 5 have not scheduled a 6-week postpartum visit



55% do not have a regular medical care provider

- Firearm safety







Support for parents

- Parent well-being
- Substance use in household
- Parent emotional support

Education provided at visit

- Connecting to community resources
- Screenings for substance use, postpartum depression, and interpersonal violence for every parent



RCT evaluation: 6-month in-home interviews

Compared to control families, Family Connects International families had:

- More connections to resources
- More self-reported positive parenting behaviors
- Higher quality parenting behaviors

- Safer home environments
- Higher quality childcare
- Lower self-reported anxiety



RCT evaluation results:


Child hospital administration records

Results at infant aged 12 months from aggregate hospital records

50% less total infant emergency medical care (ER visits + overnights in hospital)
 Results at infant aged 24 months from aggregate hospital records


