DISCUSSION

Showers and some thunderstorms will be possible today and tonight. The best chance for stronger thunderstorms will be this afternoon into the early evening ahead of a cold front. The stronger storms will have the potential for damaging wind gusts. An isolated spin-up tornado can't be ruled out, although probabilities are currently very low. Rainfall amounts of 1.5 to 2" will be possible along and west of the I-49 corridor with a half inch to inch east of there. Some localized flooding will be possible if some training can occur, but widespread flooding is not expected. Some rises on creeks and stream will occur, but widespread river flooding is not expected. A wind advisory is in effect for areas generally west of the U.S. 65 corridor where wind gusts up to 45 mph will be possible.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"





