DISCUSSION

Accumulating snowfall is likely beginning this evening through Friday afternoon. Highest snowfall amounts generally along/south of I-44 towards the MO-AR border. Expect minor to moderate travel impacts for Friday.

Snow will likely develop in bands, so amounts could vary over fairly short distances. All precipitation will be snow; there is no expectation for wintry mix. Accumulating snowfall will continue into Friday morning and afternoon. Snowfall accumulations of 2-4" north of I-44, and 4-6" south of I-44.

Greene County will likely have moderate impacts due to the snowfall, leading to potentially hazardous driving conditions.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Consider a winter storm kit for your car & winterize cars.
- Stay off the roads if at all possible. If trapped in your car, then stay inside.
- Bring pets indoors or to a warm dry place with plenty of food.
- Prepare for power outages.
- Know and watch for signs of hypothermia and frostbite.
- Practice generator safety and only use outside of home.
- Pay close attention to upcoming weather information.
- Watch for social media posts from OEM and our partners.

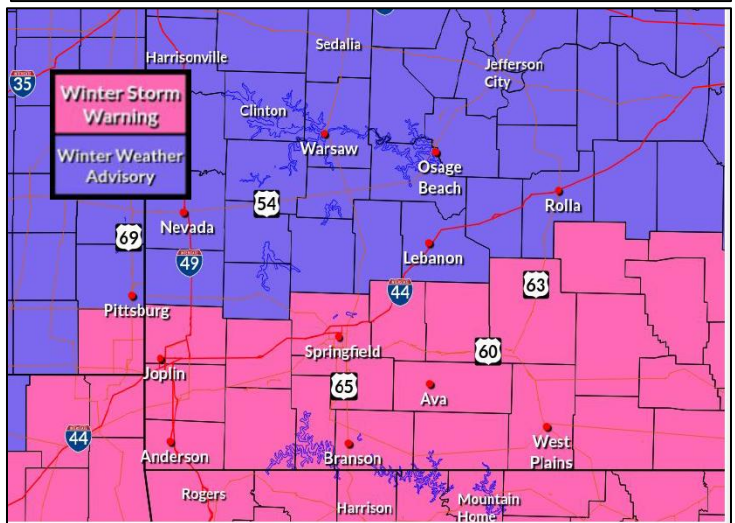
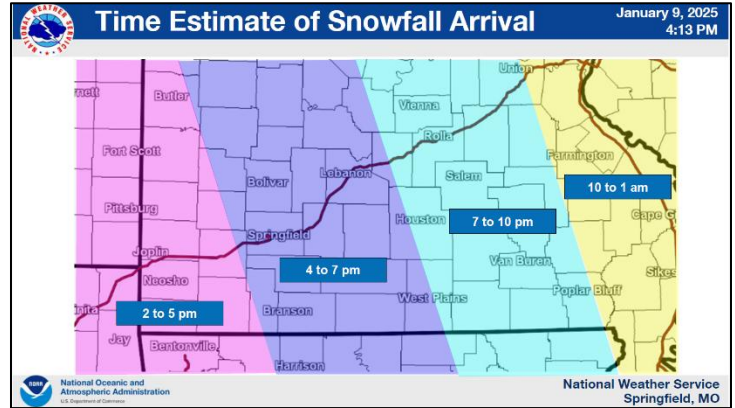
