#### DISCUSSION

Scattered thunderstorms will develop and move west to east through the area late tonight into early Tuesday morning. There is a Marginal Severe Weather Outlook (level 1 of 5). Hazards include hail up the size of quarters and damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph. Additionally, non-thunderstorm southerly wind gusts up to 35 through tonight. Round one is through Tuesday morning. Round two is mid Tuesday morning through the early afternoon. Round three is midafternoon through the evening. Hazards include hail up the size of quarters and damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph. A low tornado risk exists with round three. There is also a Marginal to Slight Excessive Rainfall Outlook leading to localized flooding with this system. Rain transitions to a rain/snow mix late Tuesday night, before turning to all snow early Wednesday morning. Light accumulations around a dusting to a half inch, with localized amounts up to one inch.

#### **CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT**

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
  "Turn around . . . don't drown!"




